News From the Rector

Ministry Leader's Meeting

All are invited to come to the Ministry Leader's Meeting on Monday Evening, April 4, at 6:30PM. Staff, Vestry and Ministry Leaders are required to be present as we discuss important aspects of ministry at St. Timothy's. A light dinner will be provided.

Palm Sunday, Holy Week, and Easter

On Palm Sunday, April 17, we will have only two services, at 7:30 AM and 10:00 AM. The 10:00 o'clock service is combined due to the Palm Sunday procession and because many people enjoy a blended service from time to time.

On Holy Wednesday (April 20) we will have the Holy Eucharist at both 12:00 Noon and 6:00 PM. At 6:45 PM we will offer the Service of Tenebrae, the purpose of which is to recreate the emotional aspects of the passion story. We read from Scripture, move from light to darkness, listen (and feel) the earthquake, and leave the church in silence by the light of one candle (the Christ Candle).

On Maundy Thursday (April 21) we will celebrate the Holy Eucharist at 7:00 PM with foot washing for those who choose to come forward. The service is followed by the removal of the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose in the parish hall (set up to resemble the Garden of Gethsemane), followed by the stripping of the altar in near darkness as we prepare for the Day of Christ's Crucifixion. This is followed by the all night vigil at the Garden (parish hall) for those who would like to come and pray for one hour. A sign-up sheet will be available, but anyone can keep vigil at any time.

On Good Friday (April 22) at 12:00 Noon we will have the one hour Noon Day Liturgy which includes reading the Passion Narrative, the homily, the Veneration of the Cross (for those who would like to come forward to kiss the foot of the cross), the Solemn Prayers, the Communion from the reserved sacrament (Good Friday is the one day of the year when we are not allowed to consecrate the elements). And then at **6:30 PM we will offer the Stations of the Cross.**

On Holy Saturday (April 23) at 7:00 PM we will offer the Easter Vigil. This includes the blessing and lighting of the new Paschal (Christ) Candle, the reading of lessons from Holy Scripture pertaining to salvation history surrounded by Canticles and Prayers, possible baptisms. The service would normally go into the early morning hours and end with the first Easter Service. We conclude about an hour after the baptisms with a dismissal, and return the next morning.

On Easter Sunday (April 24) we will celebrate the Risen Lord with services at 7:30, 8:45 and 11:00 AM with an Easter Egg Hunt for the kids at 10:20 AM in our field behind the church by the playground.

I look forward to participating in all of these holy events and hope to see you at as many as you are able.

(Fr. Stan continued)

My Final Article on The Instructed Eucharist....

Well, we finally come to the conclusion of the Instructed Eucharist that I have been writing about since last October. This month we continue with the Lord's Prayer. This prayer either speaks for itself, or lends itself to be taught in an article all to itself (in fact, I will probably do a sermon series on the Lord's Prayer in the next few months). We then move to ...

The Third Eucharistic Action --- The Breaking of the Bread

This act is part of the ancient imagery of the Eucharist. The early Christians used a single loaf as a means of participation in the one church and the one Christ. At the first Eucharist and in those of the early Church, it was necessary to break the loaves or cakes of bread so that they could be distributed for Communion. For many, this breaking of bread has taken on a new significance: it has become a reminder of the breaking of Christ's body on the Cross. To symbolize this action, some celebrants such as myself, break a large wafer in two, called the Priest's Host. The Priest says, "Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us. Therefore let us keep the feast." Or the Agnus Dei is said or sung: "O Lamb of God, that takest away the sins of the world. Have mercy upon us." And then we have the Invitation to come forward, "The gifts of God for the people of God."

This is followed by

The Fourth Eucharistic Action --The Giving

The gifts of bread and wine we gave in the Offertory (representing our lives and labor) are now returned to us. But because God has accepted them and used them for His ends, they are changed. They are transformed into His Real Presence, the Body and Blood of Christ, and given to us so that we may be transformed and spiritually nourished.

Our part in all of this, remember, is found in the offering of our lives to God. God's part, and only God's part, because we cannot do this on our own, is the consecration and the transformation of our lives into what God wants us to be. It is God who does the consecrating, and it is God who does

the transforming. God the Holy Spirit transforms the bread and the wine into the Real Presence of His Own Body and Blood.

We must remember that Holy Communion is not just some subjective exercise in which we imagine Christ to be present. These Holy Mysteries are not merely the memorial of an absent, past, historic, Jesus. The bread and the wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. Christ's Body is really present, and really given, and really received. This transformation actually takes place. We don't know how. It cannot be measured scientifically. There is no chemical change. It's like at our Baptisms, when the Spirit of God descends upon us, and we become members of the Risen Body of Christ. There is no physical change. There is nothing new that can be seen with our physical eye, oh but what a difference is seen with our spiritual eyes, the eyes of faith, the eyes of believing, the eyes of seeing God active in the life of the individual and in the life of the Church.

This is the way it is with the bread and the wine at the Eucharist. We see no physical change, but we know through the eyes of faith and the eyes of believing that this has become the Body and Blood of our Lord.

So, Holy Communion is administered, and afterward the remainder of the consecrated bread and wine is consumed, or reserved in the tabernacle, so that we might take the sacrament to the sick and the shut-ins. The chalice is rinsed with water. We conclude the service by saying together the Prayer of Thanksgiving after Holy Communion and singing a concluding hymn or song of praise.

The service ends with the blessing and the dismissal. The dismissal was traditionally the role of the deacon, telling the people that the service was ended (and in our case, to remind us that we are to go forth to know, love, serve and obey Christ); and after a joyful reunion with Christ and their fellow brothers and sisters, it is always fitting to respond, "(And to make Him known to other), Thanks be to God".

Electrical Plan Information

If you are in the market for an energy program for your home, Gemini has reviewed the residential market and found a competitively priced alternative with a strong financial position in the marketplace, offering savings and a unique opportunity for the Church to benefit from your electricity consumption.

The rates you will pay are very competitive if not the lowest available and you get the benefit of a Power Broker, Dr. J Ferry of Texas Energy Options, as your advocate for your electrical power needs. In addition, as you consume power, the Church earns a small percentage of your kilowatt usage to be applied to energy savings projects.

If you are currently under a contract for your power, you need to wait until the contract renews. Contact your current electrical provider (see your bill for contract information) this information.

If you want to compare rates, be sure to include all costs as shown in the amount that you pay on your current bill.

To change your service, follow these steps to register and begin saving.

Review available plans and make a selection. The 12 month Green Power rate was assumed in the worksheet (pricing may have changed slightly since this sheet was put together so use the number on the screen to recalculate your savings if it differs).

You may select whichever plan you would like but the current recommendation is a 12 month plan and the Green Power plan is 100% green energy.

Complete the form and receive a verification number.

Forward the verification number to jimboggs@geminiintegration.com to assist in confirming shared savings distribution for the Church. Jim will also answer any questions that you may have.

An application can be put in place up to sixty days prior to your initial connection or renewal. Since transfers take about eight business days, it is better to get the request in at least ten days prior to your contract expiration. Champion Energy has a space for the preferred transfer date.

If you renew, be sure to use the church code to continue the distributions.

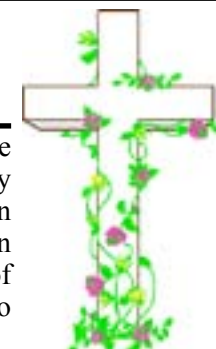

Evangelism

We are now deep into the heart of Lent, which along with Advent are my favorite seasons of the Christian calendar. Advent is a season of anticipation, of looking for the coming of Jesus not only as an infant 2000 years ago but also in His triumphant return. Lent is a time of penitence. It is a call to examine our lives and our sins, to remember our earthly mortality, to recall the costs Christ paid for us to be able to overcome death and to live with Him for eternity. Both are seasons that ask for personal reflection and inventory, prayer and praise, confession and celebration. What makes Lent so different for me is that the church includes numerous opportunities to do this together as a Body.

Advent has no 'special services' beyond the 4 Sundays. At St. Timothy's we offer opportunities for Lenten worship from the first day – Ash Wednesday, to the last – Easter Vigil on the Saturday of Holy Week. In between we have Stations of the Cross, the Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, Tenebrae, Maundy Thursday Holy Eucharist with foot washing and the stripping of the altar, All Night Vigil in the Garden of Repose and the Good Friday liturgy with the veneration of the Cross.

Whew! I imagine that some of you are saying "Man that is a lot of church!" You know what? You are right. It is a lot of church, and I can tell you from personal experience that it is

some of the most powerful church I have had the blessing to be a part of each year. Easy it is not. These services deal in the darkness and the death of Jesus. But it is only by experiencing the darkness that we can truly appreciate the universe changing light that comes with Easter Sunday.

I hope that each of you are able to come to at least one additional service this Lent. If you always come to Ash Wednesday or Maundy Thursday, I hope you can come to at least one other service that you never or seldom attended. I have to put in my own personal plug here. If you have never been to Stations of the Cross at St. Timothy's please put that at the top of your list. The liturgy that we use makes it for me, one of our most personal and moving services. It is a wonderful reminder of what we are called to be as Christians.

Each of these Lenten services has a special place in who we are as Christians. We are each called to be an evangelist and the better we know who we are as God's people, the more we embrace the story, the stronger we are to proclaim the Good News to the world.

May you have a blessed Lent and a glorious Easter!

Vacation Bible School – June 13 – 17, 2011

Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. It's time to kick it old school!

In a world that is always searching for the "next big thing", some things will never change and can never be improved upon. God, His Promises, His Word, and the Gospel are unchangeable which is why the Go Fish Guys invite you to KICK IT OLD SCHOOL!

With the new VBS program "Kickin' It Old School" the Go Fish Guys continue with their concert theme, but with an 80s, retro hip-hop influence! Our leaders and kids will be "hands on" with the Bible. This program is not dependent on the theme, the music, or the Go Fish Guys. It's all about the Bible which means that it WILL be effective!

Not only are the music (using classic hymns with contemporary approach) and videos top notch, but the Bible lessons use animation and video to teach, but are not full of fluff. Our kids will travel through the Old Testament as well as the New Testament to learn about several attributes of God. From Adam and Eve to the Passover to the building of the tabernacle to Jesus on the cross, the kids will learn that God's holiness and views of sin have never changed. Churched and unchurched kids alike will hear and understand the Gospel in a whole new way!

What's Different About A Go Fish VBS?

The following is the introduction included in the *Kickin' It Old School* VBS Director's Manual. It pretty much sums up what makes their approach to VBS so unique and thought it would be helpful for you to understand why the VBS committee selected this curriculum.

On behalf of the Go Fish Guys, we would like to thank you for partnering with us to impact children with the Word of God. What an amazing privilege to be used by God to serve in this way. We are convinced that Vacation Bible School is one of the greatest opportunities we have to reach kids with the Gospel and the Truths found only in the Bible. It is with humble hearts and the fear of God that we approach a project of this magnitude. May all the glory go to God and God alone.

Our curriculum is different. We didn't do this to simply offer just another option in the overcrowded world of VBS publishers. We wanted to change the rules and offer you a chance to approach VBS in a fresh, new way. We reject the notion that kids need a lot of "hype" in order to be effectively reached with the Gospel. Quite frankly, we believe it's offensive and arrogant to think we can do anything to improve upon what our holy God has so beautifully laid out for us in Scripture.

The first thing you'll notice is that our starter kit is small, simple, and easy to navigate. This was intentional. You need to understand that this program does not focus solely on the "extras". Instead of putting our time and resources into toys and trinkets, we decided to focus on making great music, engaging videos, and Bible teaching that didn't water down the Gospel.

We're entertainers. We've sold well over 1 million albums and if you've ever seen us in concert, you know that we like to blow stuff up and put on a major show! We understand how to draw a crowd and get kids excited. However, vacation Bible school needs to be about more than that. We have kids coming into church voluntarily for something called vacation Bible school. Why would we ever pass up the opportunity to dig in and actually teach the Bible? Kids have plenty of avenues for entertainment, yet they are spiritually starving. Let's make the most of this week and give them the one thing the world cannot. Let's give them God and His Truth!

We have worked harder and put more financial resources into this project than anything else in our careers. We do so knowing that when God's Word is used, it NEVER returns void. Investing in kids and partnering with churches to teach the holiness of God is something that we do with a joy and a hope that the world will never understand.

We are praying for you as you kick it old school with your kids! We've done our best to give you a solid foundation to build your VBS on. Just remember that the success of your VBS does not depend upon you, the Go Fish Guys, or our clever ideas. The Gospel has the power to save and when we are faithful to deliver it, God will take over from there. Focus on God, the Gospel, and on the Bible and you will have a great week...we promise!

Christian Formation



Last month I shared with you some of my thoughts on growth groups and what I have learned from them, here are a few additional observations I've made that I'd like to share with you ...

- Sometimes the best curriculum is the curriculum of life.** I have discovered again that as the Word became flesh in Christ, so it does in them—through their hands, feet, hearts and hope poured out for Christ to me.
- Everyone has something to teach me.** The childhood loss of one serves as comfort for me and others today. Cancer in one serves to support cancer in another. Intimacy of one grew intimacy in another. Now I just look to see who and where I am "triggered" today in order to see the potential of a "teacher" tomorrow. Sometimes one person in the group has made me mad, another sad, and both have grown to be gifts to me.
- Bad days are sometimes the best days.** This truth has taken me from days of not wanting to go to my growth group to anticipating what I will learn when I do. I've come to realize that it's not a question of whether they care but will I let them care. I've learned that if I am going to try and live my life alone I can, but I don't have to, and if I do it's my fault. I make myself alone by not making myself known.
- Yes I am crazy. Yes I am overly passionate. But there is something sacred in the circle, and it's my place, my path and my purpose in life!** They have helped authenticate my calling in life.
