From the Rector

Dear Parish Family,

I remember a time riding in the car with my family, with my dad driving. It was at night, and it was raining hard. As a young child, I was afraid. I thought to myself, "How can he see? What about all the cars around him?" However, I also remember drifting off to sleep in the back seat of the car, because, you see, no matter how dark and stormy the road was, my Dad had the wheel, and I trusted him. (Unfortunately, now, I am just as afraid when I drive at night in the rain at my older age.)

I was recently reminded of a story about the English Reformer martyr, Nicholas Ridley. Ridley was a Bishop of London who lived during the times of Queen Mary's persecution of the Protestants. The night before Ridley was to be executed, we find recorded that when asked by some friends if he would like them to stay up with him that night, he said, "No, no, that you shall not. For I mind (God willing) to go to bed, and to sleep as quietly tonight, as ever I did in my life."

How could he sleep before his execution? It was because he knew that his heavenly Father had the wheel, no matter how dark and stormy the road ahead might be.

The Psalmist wrote about this experience in Psalm 4:8, "I will lay me down in peace, and take my rest; for you, Lord, only, make me dwell in safety." Another way to say this is found in Psalm 46:10, "Be still then and know that I am God."

I say to you, still your heart, because God is God. No matter what happens, no matter what your experience may be, there is not a square inch in this universe, or moment in time, over which he does not reign.

Lay your head on this pillow and sleep: God is God. Whisper to your heart, "Be still, heart, God is God." Fall recklessly into the pillow of his sovereignty, his love, mercy, and care.

What is happening in your life? What anxiety is keeping you up at night? You can drift off to sleep because your Heavenly Father has the wheel, and no matter how dark and stormy the road might be, you can trust him with your life.

Diocesan Women's Gathering Rejoice and Be Blessed



She and her husband, Larry, have been married for 40 years and have three grown children and two daughters-inlove. (Fr. Stan cont. on pg. 3)





St. Timothy Scholarship Program Available

St. Timothy's annual Scholarship Program applications are now available. This program is open to all students going to college, university or trade school. Scholarships of \$1,000 are available, paid out in semesters. Payments are \$500 on August 15 and \$500 on December 15 for the full year.

Requirements for applications are that the student be a member of St. Timothy's and be entering or attending either a college, university, or trade school in the Fall of 2024. An application must be filled out for each year that the student applies. The original application requires a short essay on their future plans for attendance at that establishment. Two recommendations must be sent in with the first application, with at least one from a member of St. Timothy's congregation. Subsequent applications will only need the application form filled out.

If you are interested, please fill out an application and return it to the front office before July 1, 2024. The number of scholarships accepted will be based on available funds for that year. If you have any questions, please direct them to Deacon Jennifer Scherzer or Judith Jordan.

Praver Shawl Ministry



From the Organ Bench

"And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them."—Ac 2:2-3

It's a bit ironic: just when the Holy Spirit starts to heat things up, we start to slow down. The long seasons of Lent and Holy Week conquered, all those of us who exhausted ourselves working overtime to 'make it happen' (really, it is only the Spirit within us) look forward longingly to a period of respite, however brief. But it was not so with the early Church; the season after Pentecost was—for them—when the true work began. They, like us, could do nothing until the Spirit gave them the path, the purpose, and the power. They took that mandate and carried it to the four corners of the known earth.

What are we doing? What is our mandate? What gospel are we going to carry with us on our cruises and trips to visit the grandkids? The penultimate verse of an old hymn (#525 in our hymnal), looking forward to the end of all strife, says: "and the great Church victorious shall be the Church at rest." Somehow I don't think roadtrips and the beach are what the poet had in mind. A considerably more recent artist asks, "Where will you run my soul? Where will you go when wells run dry? When the wind starts to blow, how you gonna keep this flame alive?"

If we are taking our rest in anything but the One who is our rest, who created the Sabbath as a gift to bring us closer to Him, we will gain nothing. But how do we achieve that rest? The question of how to keep the flames of Pentecost alive in our hearts is a legitimate one, but the answer, I think, is quite plain, as the joy of the early Church in its fervor also testifies to: one does not keep a flame alive by isolating it, holding it close and safe. "No one after lighting a lamp puts it in a cellar or under a basket, but on a stand, so that those who enter may see the light" (Lk 11:33). To keep a fire going, the easiest way is to let it spread. That doesn't necessarily mean going out to preach on street corners (though for some it might)—one could do that and still be as dead as a doornail (see 1 Ct 13:1-3). Before any of that can happen, the best—and sometimes scariest—place to let the fire spread is within each of our own souls.

Because the only way any of us will achieve any rest is by letting the Holy Spirit take the things that are weighing us down and returning them to the dust from whence they came. True Sabbath rest is not a cessation from activity, as the Pharisees might have us believe, but a freedom from what was to become what we are and will be forever—children of the King. "For you are all children of light, children of the day. We are not of the night or of the darkness" (1 Th 5:5). "This means that it is not the children of the flesh who are the children of God, but the children of the promise are counted as offspring" (Rm 9:8). Or as Jesus tells Peter, "then the sons are free" (Mt 17:26b). Wherever you find yourself these next few months, I pray that you will burn brightly in the perfect rest and freedom that comes from knowing the Lord—and through Him—yourself.

If we don't teach our children how to follow Christ, the world will teach them not to.

Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will direct your paths. Proverbs 3:5-6

It seems like I keep coming back to the themes of trust and obedience. Unfortunately, that describes us, too. Their lives were capsulated in the words of the Bible for us to read and ponder to lead us away from that slippery slope we all deal with at some point in our Christian walk. Trust and obedience aren't easy or comfortable and yet the Bible shows us time and time again how God uses the most unlikely people to teach us these lessons, like Joshua and Rahab. What a great summary of all the lessons we've learned this year as we wrap up our regular classes in early May.


