We have begun, through our 24ToDouble Ministry, to work on our Vision Statement (our purpose and process) here at St. Timothy's. We already have a Mission Statement that everyone knows because we use it as the dismissal at every Holy Eucharist.

 That is our mission! That is what we are mandated by the Gospel to do!

We also have a well-developed set of Core Values which we print on the front page of every bulletin every Sunday of the year.




An evening of games and a potluck dinner for adults. All adults are invited to join us for this evening of food, friends, conversation and a little competition.

Our next 24ToDouble Gathering will be on **June 24 at 6:00pm** in the parish hall. All are invited.

This next module (Module 3) will deal with Laity Involvement Through the Pastor's Meal (*Team 5 - Care and Follow-up*). It will concentrate on the "Pastor's Meal" which is the best method for involving laity in ministry in order for discipleship to take place. Four areas are covered in the "Pastor's Meal": church's vision, evangelism training, spiritual gifts discovery/training and discipleship through lay involvement. A "Pastor's Meal" offers friends, follow-up, leads, commitment and importance.

From the Deacon's Desk

Imagine that you are beginning your first day in Israel with a short bus ride to the city of old Joppa where you get a quick glimpse of the house of Simon the Tanner where Peter had a vision that sets the stage for our first stop, then you drive along the coast of the Mediterranean Sea to Caesarea by the Sea. There you'll have a casual walk through the Roman ruins of the great Theater and Aqueduct, as well as the Crusader city later built on this site. This is the place where Paul left for his final missionary journey. These stories in Acts are powerful evidence of God at work as the church is being formed...and you walk in the same places that they would have walked.

Imagine an experienced Jewish guide who narrates your tour and fills your bus rides with stories, but also imagine times of scripture reading and prayer selected to reinforce what you have seen and what you will see next, as well as teaching from your clergy interspersed in these talks.

You'll continue in your air conditioned bus to Mt. Carmel where Elijah confronted the prophets of Baal. A short walk up a hill to the top of Mt. Carmel and its panoramic view of the Galilee region will leave you in awe of the promised land and how small the region really is. Next you'll travel to Megiddo, also known as Armageddon, where we will learn how archeology uncovers the past. For those who are ready, the full tour is fascinating...but even a casual walk through a few of the sites here is possible for those of us less mobile.

Then it is on to Nazareth where the angel appeared to Mary to announce that she would be the mother of God's Son. This is also the place where Jesus spent his childhood years. Thankfully there is little walking here, but from there you'll drive through Cana where Jesus performed his first miracle as we proceed to Tiberias for dinner filled with conversation about all that we have seen and heard. That is day one of a tour in Israel, and that alone will recharge your spiritual batteries and give you a lifetime of imagining scripture in new ways that have the power to change lives forever.

For those who are able we invite you to join us, for those who cannot go at this time, we will continue to share stories of Israel to tide you over until you can make this trip which every Christian should take at least once in their lives.

Ah summer. Once upon a time we were silly enough to think that summer meant that we wouldn't be as busy around here for a couple of months. Let me just say nothing could be further from the truth. While there is still a lot going on, summer does bring its own special energy that is different from the rest of the year. Vacations, workshops, camps have lots of folks in and out of church over a couple of months. There are no special religious holidays or services to plan for as we settle into the church's longest season of ordinary time. What summer does bring are some very special events.

Our second annual Light Up the Darkness concert that is sponsored by our STAY youth group kick things off. This will be followed by our Vacation Bible School where our participants will "ROAR" into the story of Moses. This is always a great outreach ministry as we welcome kids from all over our area. With July comes Soul in the City. For a week we will host over 100 kids and adults alike who use St. Timothy's as their home base, eating, sleeping, worshipping and fellowshiping here, as they go out in teams to do local mission work. The dynamics of both VBS and Soul in the City brings an excitement to everyone here even if they aren't directly involved.

This year, different from the past, we have a full set of growth group opportunities throughout the week, which allows several opportunities for study. For those who have a different personal schedule during the summer, this can give you the choice of attending one of our daily classes that you might otherwise be unable to. Please don't let possible vacation plans and missed classes keep you from attending. All the leaders would rather have you there when possible than not have you there at all.

Light Up the Darkness, VBS and Soul in the City are all events that can use volunteer help. Even if you can only give a couple of hours there is somewhere where you can be plugged in. The concert requires both set up, break down and clean up that will require lots of hands. Both Soul in the City and VBS offer food each day that needs prep and clean up. If you are unable to help with Light Up the Darkness I hope you can attend. Bring your family, friends, and neighbors, spread the word! The concert is on June 15, from 4 – 8pm. If you are unable to make it please consider buying a ticket or making a donation. All net proceeds will go to Hands of Justice, a Christian based anti-trafficking group formed by teenagers. This year VBS will have a special program for our 3 year-old friends, as well as our 4 -12 year old VBS. We hope that if you have kids that age in your life that you will enroll them for this exciting week of learning and fun. If you don't have kids that age, please advertise this week to those you know who do. Above and beyond all else, all of these activities ask for your prayers. Soul in the City has an organized prayer team, contact Cathy Johnson if you would like more information.

Continuing through the summer will be our monthly 24toDouble meetings. This is an exciting biblical model to help grow disciples and to keep St. Timothy's a healthy and vibrant church. Everyone is welcome to attend these sessions. This is an important period of time for our parish as we strive to follow the plan God has for us. Please keep these meetings, as well as those attending in your prayers. The next meeting is on Monday, June 24 at 6pm. Please join us!



Resolve: Prayerfully Seeking Solutions to End Human Trafficking



For the past few years I have been listening to daily Bible readings through a program called the Daily Audio Bible. If you listen every day like I do, you will hear the whole Bible read in a year. This week the Old Testament reading is from the eighteenth chapter in the book of 1 Samuel. Today I heard the account of poor King Saul who suffered terribly from headaches and depression. The only thing that would help him was listening to harp music. Ironically, the best harpist around was that shepherd boy turned giant slayer, David. (Spoiler alert! For the rest of the story keep reading through the Old Testament because these two men are destined for some serious conflict.) Whenever David played, Saul gained a brief reprieve from his suffering. Music is influential and has the ability to lift our spirits and even ease pain and discomfort. Music with lyrics that glorify God must be even more powerful, don't you think?

On Saturday, June 15th at 4 pm, our church's youth group has arranged to have a concert to benefit Hands of Justice. The concert will feature a variety of artists including Without Shelter, a pop punk band formed in North Texas in 2018. This group's music will remind you of Relient K and Paramore. There will also be a performance from Austin Lanier (see my article from May to learn more about him) and our very own contemporary worship band, Joyful Noise. Not only will this concert feature music and a message of encouragement, the profits made from this concert go to benefit Hands of Justice, a local organization that is empowering youth to fight human trafficking.

Will you join the Resolve team during the month of June to pray daily for this special event that will be at our church? We are praying for the concert, each of the artists (Without Shelter, Austin Lanier and Joyful Noise), pleasant weather, attendance, Jim Boggs, our Youth Group, Hands of Justice, and HOJ leader Becca Carry.

About Your Safety

Last month, you read about the St. Timothy’s Safety Team and the volunteers that provide their time and talent to keeping you out of harm’s way. We have been working on our response plan for many types of emergencies, and we will continue to improve our strategies as we gain more experience.

Now, it does little good to have a plan if the people of St. Timothy’s don’t know who to follow when an emergency happens. We feel that it is important for you to know the people who are watching out for you, which is why we will feature a member of the team each month, along with their suggested safety tip.

This month we feature George Vick.

Most of you know George. You see him most every Sunday ushering at the contemporary service, and frequently in the kitchen preparing some of the wonderful food that we all enjoy. And while you may not know it, George is always thinking about your safety. He can’t help it, and that’s a good thing.

You see, George retired from the Houston Fire Department after a 32-year career. During that time, he served as a firefighter, an engineer, a paramedic and a dispatcher; and

he has training in arson and fire code. George can not only spot problems before most of us can, he can use his more than three decades of public safety experience to help us prevent emergencies from happening in the first place. He has a great tip for us this month.

When an emergency occurs, don’t make 9-1-1 your first call.

It has become our nature when an event happens to reach for our cell phone and call for emergency services. And while that may be necessary sometimes, your first call should be to a member of the Safety Team, if possible. We likely have a plan in place; and summoning first responders may only confuse the situation and prevent us from efficiently serving you.

CHILDREN & YOUTH EDUCATION

If we don't teach our children how to follow Christ, the world will teach them not to.

When I can't find my sticky note pad, I know that I either need to clean up my desk or everything is getting very busy. With VBS right around the corner, you can guess which one applies. I have piles everywhere: a pile for WoRM and QUEST, a pile for VBS and a pile for 24 to Double are going on my desk right now with Parent 2 Parent, STICKY NOTES, the nursery and children's choirs rolling around somewhere to the side. Yep, definitely busy! But it's a good busy—it means God's work is being done and I get to help. What about you? Is God nudging you to get busy? Where can you serve best? One of the next steps in 24 to Double will be for each of us to take a gift inventory. What special passions and abilities has God gifted you with? Our high school seniors are wrestling with choosing the right career path. Many of the rest of us struggle to reconcile the job choices we made. One study found that only 13% of all workers find their job meaningful. No wonder commuters look so glum. So how do you find the job or ministry that will bring you fulfillment? Follow the bread crumbs... What special abilities has God given you? What are your strengths? God loves you too much to give you a task without the skills needed to complete it. Figure out what you do well and then look for the ministry that will allow you to shine. That is where God wants you. And it's all about God and His will for our lives and for our church. So follow the bread crumbs and see where God is leading you. And if you discover that your path leads to the children's hall, let me know and I'll guide you to the right place.

Don't forget that VBS is here! During the week of June 24-28 there will lots of little paws padding around St. Timothy's from 9 to noon each day. The theme this year takes us out into the African savannah as we follow Moses' life and path. We will be looking for adult volunteers to help out in the Wilderness Adventure Room (a dramatic storytelling venue), Imagination Station (an experiment based small group room), Kid Vid Cinema (videos following a group of kids from Africa), Hungry Herd Café (kitchen snack crew), Stampede Sports (outdoor games) and Little Paws (preschool activities room). 




